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Purpose: The role of the Lead Teacher is to collaborate with and support other lead teachers in providing an educational and stimulating classroom environment for young children. Training, support, and coaching are available to help teachers address the needs of all children in their classroom, while implementing Positive Behavior Supports. This position will allow the right candidate to work with children ages 2.5years old to school age.

Minimum Job Requirements

- * One year experience in a licensed childcare facility AND meet qualifications for K.A.R. 28-4-429(c)
- * Health assessment and negative TB test on file
- * Trained in First Aid, CPR, Child Development, Childhood Illness, Signs and Symptoms of Child Abuse with Abusive Head Trauma
- * Satisfactory KBI Criminal Background Check
- * Participate in Orientation Training at time of acceptance
- * Participate in Positive Behavior Support Training and coaching

Positive Bright Start Child Care operates under the belief that all children have special needs and special strengths, and in the appropriate learning environment, all children can learn from their peers as well as their teachers. Our teaching staff will have been trained in the Positive Behavior Support model. Positive Behavior Support (PBS) is a problem solving approach to behavioral support that uses assessment data to make decisions, preventative strategies to reduce incidence of challenging behavior, and instructional strategies to teach the child replacement skills for problem behavior.
